▶ **MASSACHUSETTS PRIMARY CARE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SCREENING TOOLKIT**

Provides mental health guidelines and screening tools for use in a pediatric primary care setting including the PSC (Pediatrics Symptoms Checklist), SDQ (Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire) and PHQ-9 (Patient Health Questionnaire for depression)

▶ **SCARED:** (Anxiety scale)

This tool screens children and adolescents age 8 and older for anxiety disorders. Both SCARED versions contain 41 items that measure five factors: general anxiety, separation anxiety, social phobia, school phobia, and physical symptoms of anxiety.
